#### ACCREDITATION RECOMMENDATIONS

The accreditation assessment team suggests the following recomme

The Al-Asar Institute of Technology will not be awarded an Institutional Accreditation as it could not obtain 50% score in some critical areas (i.e., 1.2,1.3,1.4, 2.6, 3.4, 3.6, and 9.1) though the institute achieved 501 marks out of total 1000 marks (50.1%) in the institutional assessment.

#### Vertical Assessment:

- 1. DAE Civil Technology: Score obtained 164 out of total 255 marks (64.31%)
   2. DAE Electrical Technology: Score obtained 167 out of total 255 marks
- (65.40%)

  N 3. DAE Mechanical Technology: Score obtained 172 marks out of total 255 marks (67.45%)

- DAE Electronics Technology: Score obtained 57 out of total 80 (71.20%)
   Industrial Electrician (3-6 Months) course: 45 out of total 80 (56.25%)

Since the institute has attained <u>more than 50% marks</u> in Civil Technology, Electrical Technology and Mechanical Technology in vertical assessment and also more than 50% score in DAE Electronics and Industrial Electrician (3-6) months course in horizontal assessment, therefore, the Program accreditation will be awarded in all these Trades.

#### MONSOON RAIN DISASTER INTERIOR (SINDH) PAKISTAN

Due to the heavy rains in the province Sindh the part of lower Sindh has been very much effected. The crops are totally damaged their houses and in 3 to 4 feet of water. It happened so fast that they could not save any of their belongings. Everything is under the water even their wheat and all the food grain is destroyed. They have migrated to the higher grounds. Their first priority is food stuff (Ration). As the water recedes we will have to help them rebuild their houses. At the moment we have 400 families who need help. The package of Ration will cost us approx. RS 3000.
